17 March 2013 new incapacity law 231 articles






Functioning principles of the current software in the justices of the peace in Belgium

Advantages of this computerised approach for time management

- The automated production of judicial acts
 - Merging of standard texts with database
 - Recording of produced acts in the database
- Through the software application, an easier implementation of a complicated law
 - Once a judicial act is chosen, the normal following steps (summons, minutes, reminders...) are automatically produced
- A uniformity of the implementation of the new law
 - Procedures
 - Standard text
- A uniformity of the registration of the handlings
 - Better measurement of workload.
 - Better repartition of the available resources

Difficulties of this computerised approach

- Necessity of getting people of different horizons work together
 - Judges
 - Clerks
 - Administration
 - Software specialists
- Need of skills witch are not necessarily available in the judiciary
- Much time is needed of judicial personnel for the work that cannot be outsourced
 - Defining the needs in terms of judiciary procedures
 - Writing of standard texts
 - Knowledge of the existing systems
- Convincing the judiciary to work with non-judicial methods
 - BPMN
 - Computer applications

Risks of this computerised approach

- Standard decisions instead of real "custom" judgements
- Procedures and decisions controlled by managers and not by judges
- How to control these risks
 - Implication of judges and clerks
 - Possibility to change the standard procedures and texts
 - More time for special cases and real decision making
